Homework Assignments: 30%; Midterm(Monday, October 24): 20%; Final(Time TBA): 50%.

Once your request is approved, the weight of the missed assignment will be divided evenly among the remaining assignments, and that of the missed midterm will be divided evenly among the remaining components of the course resulting in 40% for the homework assignments and 60% for the final exam.
